You should look for someone in your area. Happy D Ranch is on the West Coast, Early Bird Worms is on the East Coast and Acme Worm Farm is in the Mid-West. All three of these have been good suppliers for me. NC State University has a listing of suppliers by state on their web site. Shop around for a good price. The cost for a pound of worms can vary greatly.
